Doing good together

Introduction

This year marks 180 years of co-operation. From humble beginnings in Rochdale, the global co-operative movement is now 3 million strong. From retail co-ops to housing co-ops, agricultural co-ops to tech co-ops, each one has the wellbeing of its people, members and communities at its core thanks to the co-operative values and principles that underpin all co-ops.

To bolster the UK's vibrant co-operative landscape, with a focus on our core trading area*, in May 2022 Your Co-op pledged to support the creation of 50 new co-operative businesses by January 2027.

Why? We believe the co-operative business model to be a sound and beneficial one, with new coops almost twice as likely to succeed as start-ups using other business models. Plus, doing good together is in our DNA. Working

with other co-ops is not only one of the co-operative principles, this initiative also forms a key part of our member-led Sustainability Strategy.

Now 18 months into our pledge, this short report offers an overview of what's been achieved so far working with our partner organisations, including Co-operative Futures, Plunkett Foundation and ICOF (Co-operative and Community Finance). We'll also take a look at what's in the pipeline for the future.

Case Study: Amberley Shop on the Common

When the village shop in Amberley, Gloucestershire closed, the community started searching for alternative locations to create a new community-run store, providing essential goods for local people unable to reach nearby towns. After much research, they have now created a café and a retail space in the nave of the village church providing good quality local produce, services and opportunities to all interest and age groups.



Plunkett advised the group as they explored their options. The group raised money through its 227 members and Plunkett helped them identify other sources of funding to reach their target.



Case Study: Blackbridge Charitable Community Benefit Society

Co-operative Futures worked with a group of residents and community organisations to set up the Blackbridge Charitable Community Benefit Society (Blackbridge CCBS), a community co-operative supporting wellbeing, learning, skills, and employment advice in Podsmead, Gloucester.

A key project of Blackbridge CCBS is the development of the Blackbridge Community and Sports Hub. The hub, which has now gained funding, will provide a wide range of sports activities with an emphasis on working with young people. Their work has already begun by offering opportunities for local children to try out different sports with a professional athletics coach and running a grounds maintenance course to help local people learn new skills.

Plans for 2024 and beyond

Looking ahead we plan to...

- Continue to provide funding to our partner organisations
- Offer training and support to new co-ops in conjunction with our partners
- Provide advice and consultation on retailing and sustainability
- Host consultations with our partners to find new ways to support them and the co-ops they work with

Plus, we'll be on the lookout for other ways to do good together and support new co-ops. **Watch this space!**

Case Study:

Bright Future

Your Co-op was one of the first organisations to work with Bright Future – a collaborative employment co-operative that brings charities and businesses together to create jobs for victims of modern slavery. Slavery survivors are offered a four-week paid work placement, leading to a non-competitive job interview, and potentially a permanent role.

Bright Future now has 33 members: 20 organisations who refer service users and 13 business members offering employment opportunities. Your Co-op also has representation on the Bright Future board. So far 77 people have found stable work through Bright Future.
